

Allotment Plot Plan

Get the plot down on paper to a consistent scale, so bed lengths, seed quantities and next year's rotation can be worked out in the warm.

A squared sheet for drawing the plot as it actually is, with a bed-by-bed key and a four-year rotation table to fill in over the page.

SET THE SCALE FIRST

Decide what one square stands for before you start drawing, and write it in below — a metre, a yard, a foot, half a bed. A plan drawn to a consistent square is the one you can still use next winter to work out bed lengths and seed quantities.
