

Aquarium Water Test Record

See water parameters as a trend rather than a single reading, which is the only way to spot a cycle crashing before the stock does.

Parameters over time, against the range you are aiming for, with the test kit recorded.

YOUR STOCK DECIDES THE NUMBERS, NOT US

No target parameters are printed. What is right depends entirely on what you keep — a blackwater tank, a rift lake tank and a reef are three different chemistries — and copying somebody else’s numbers is how stock is lost. Write your own targets and their source at the top, and note which test kit you used, because kits disagree.

HOW TO USE THIS SHEET

- 1 Test at the same time of day, before any water change.
- 2 Record the test kit and its expiry — old reagents read wrong.
- 3 Record every reading, including the ones you did not like.
- 4 Note the water change and anything added on the same line.
