

Cat Health Record

Hold a cat's identification, insurance and treatment history on one page that a cattery, a sitter or a new practice can read.

A cat's health record on one sheet — identification, microchip, insurance, whether the cat goes out, and a running line for every vaccination and treatment with the batch number written down.

A RECORD, NOT A RECOMMENDATION

Nothing here tells you what a cat needs. What is given, how often, and what is worth testing for depends on the cat, on whether it goes outside and on where you live — that conversation belongs with your vet. Write down what they decided so that the next practice, the cattery or the sitter can read it.
