

Fire Drill Record

Record a drill in a way that captures what went badly, which is the only part that makes the next one better.

A drill recorded honestly: how long it took, who did not come out, what went wrong and what changed afterwards.

RECORD WHAT WENT WRONG

The only useful drill record is one that says what went badly. A sheet of ticks proves the drill happened and teaches nobody anything. What must be tested or recorded, how often, by whom and how long the record must be kept differ by country and by the kind of premises. This sheet prints no interval and no criterion, names no scheme and satisfies no regulation on its own.
