

Hive Inspection Record Card

Build a run of comparable inspections for one colony, so a failing hive can be told apart from a normal one by looking at the page rather than by memory.

One line per inspection for a single colony, so this visit can be read against the last three. Keep one card per hive and take it to the apiary — the comparison is the whole point of it.

YOUR FIGURES, AND YOUR LOCAL RULES

No counts, thresholds, treatments or intervals are printed on this card. What may be used in a hive, what has to be reported and to whom, and how records must be kept all differ by country and region and they change — take those from your association and from the authority responsible where you keep bees, and record here what you were told and what you actually did.
