

Pet Emergency Information Sheet

Put everything a neighbour, a sitter or an emergency responder would need onto one page and leave it where a stranger would look.

Animal, vet, out-of-hours vet, insurance, microchip and medical conditions on one page, with a list of the people allowed to collect the animal on the second. Printed to go on the fridge door rather than into a folder.

A CHIP WITH AN OLD PHONE NUMBER IS NO HELP

Fill it in and put it somewhere a stranger would look. Then check the microchip database has your current phone number — a chip is only as useful as the record attached to it, and registration rules differ from country to country, so check what applies where you live.
