

Plant Propagation Record

Record what struck and what did not, so your own conditions become the reference instead of a general table.

Cuttings, divisions and seed raised at home — what was taken, from what, when, and how many actually struck.

YOUR RESULTS ARE THE REFERENCE

No rooting times, hormone treatments or methods are printed here. They differ by plant and by season, and the point of keeping a propagation record is to learn what works in your conditions rather than to follow a table.

HOW TO USE THIS SHEET

- 1
- Label the tray with the same batch number you write here, in pencil.
- 2
- Record the parent plant well enough to go back to it.
- 3
- Count what struck, honestly, and write the strike rate — it is the only figure that tells you whether to change anything.
