

Sheep Flock Record

Keep the flock on paper, so that a ewe's history is something you can read at the handling pens rather than something you half remember.

One line per ewe — tag, age, breeding, condition and what she has been through — so the flock is a record rather than a recollection.

A RECORD OF YOUR FLOCK, NOT ADVICE ABOUT IT

Nothing here tells you what to do. No condition scores, tupping dates, treatments or intervals are printed, because they depend on your breed, ground, system and vet. Write down what you decided and what you did.

HOW TO USE THIS SHEET

- 1 Keep one sheet per group and write the group on it — mixing groups on one page is what makes a record useless at scanning time.
- 2 Record the tag exactly as it reads, including the flock number.
- 3 Score condition in whatever scale you use, and say at the top what that scale is.
- 4 Note treatments in the medicine record as well; this column is only a pointer to it.
